

A colouring-in game for one person. Can you fill adjacent tulips in different colours?

You need: six pencils in different colours and three dice (or roll online).

Before Playing

- -Fill each of these dice in a different colour.
- Number the columns 1-3 and rows 4-6.














- 1. Roll the three dice.
- Allocate the results. Use one result for the column, one for the row, and one for the colour.
- 3. Choose a blank tulip in that column and row, and fill with the colour chosen. Tulips which cross rows or columns count as either.


Repeat until all the tulips have been filled with colour.


How to Score

Score one point for each tulip which does NOT share a space (i.e. the same row and column) with a tulip of the same colour.

up to 13 = great work! 14-16 = what a beauty! 17 = that's a perfect posy!

You could use 4 as the row and 6 as the colour to fill in any of the

tulips shown in purple. Or you could use 6 as the row and 4 as the colour to fill in any of the yellow tulips.

If your dice are all 1-3 or 4-6 and you can't pick a row or column, then either



re-roll all the dice or choose one to flip. If there are tulips left but you can't fill one in, then re-roll all the dice or flip one.
